he Adventist University of Central Africa has held its 28th Graduation Ceremony into which 621 students were conferred academic degrees on 11 December 2022, at Masoro main campus.


← ← page 9 Central Africa, Prof Kelvin Onongha, has urged them to serve unselfishly and impact communities.

"This ceremony is a symbol that you've been qualified to serve, you have the status not only to serve but serve with diligence. So, act as the main community contributors and hold high all you've learnt here, – said Prof Onongha.

He added that "AUCA is sending students out there with 21st-century soft skills and abilities to excel in the global market and make a difference in the world", and thus graduate have to "succeed without excuses."

The Vice Chancellor also stated that the university was designed to attract students from the region, and is projected to shine more, as it is embedded in the university's name and vision, the latter being 'to become an international center of academic learning with global impact'.

AUCA now has students from 25 countries across Africa and Asia, and staff from 9 nationalities from Africa, Asia,



South and North Americas. This makes it more than 30 nationalities for students and staff on its 3 campuses: Masoro, Gishushu and Ngoma Nursing campus. Among the graduates today were international students from 7 nationalities.

Marvella Kameca, graduating with a Bachelor of Science's degree in Networking and Communication Systems, and one of the best performers awarded, said that the quality of education is very commendable, adding that she felt assured of making it to the job market. She added that the

university has prepared and equipped graduates with all that they need to thrive and make a difference in the world.

Deborah Kemuma, the overall best performer of AUCA's 28th Graduation, graduating with a Bachelor of Science's degree in Nursing, revealed that the conducive academic environment contributed to her success. Candle lighting: Behind the symbolism

oday, the candle lighting ceremony symbolizes the nursing students' acceptance of the challenges pertaining to the nursing profession; and is symbolic of the lamp that Florence Nightingale famously carried during her night rounds in the military hospital wards. That practice has earned her the title of "The Lady of the Lamp".


It was at the time when Britain entered an alliance against Russia during Crimean war in 1854, and Nightingale was appointed to lead a contingent of 38 volunteer nurses to a military hospital in Scutari, in modern-day Turkey. Records have it that she tirelessly committed herself to the care of wounded soldiers, with additional creative measure to alleviate perilous health conditions.

Following her compassion, dedication and commitment to health services, caring for people's lives, Florence Naghtingale is knwown today as the mother of modern nursing sciences

I will endeavor to fulfill my rights and privileges as a good citizen and to take my share of responsibility in promoting the health and welfare of the community.


I will constantly endeavor to increase my knowledge and skills in nursing and to use them wisely.

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

- NOTE: For Nursing and Midwifery, applicants shall have a minimum C Grade in Biology and Chemistry and a minimum D Grade in Mathematics or Physics.
- Two Passport size photos in color;
- A photocopy of the National ID Card or valid Passport;

- Proof of payment of 30,000 Frw for Rwandan applicants and 50 USD Frws for internation applicants as application fee (Non-refundable)



ADVENTIST SCHOOL OF MEDICINE OF EAST-CENTRAL AFRICA

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- 1 2 (two) Certified photocopies of the secondary school certificate/diploma;
- 2 Equivalent secondary education certificate from the National Examination and School Inspection Authority (NESA) in Biology-Chemistry-Mathematics or Biology-Chemistry-Physics combinations with Grade A or B in: Biology, Chemistry and Math or Physics. In some exceptional situations, admission may be granted to applicants that have one C in Biology, Chemistry, Math or Physics.
- 3 Motivation Letter:
- 4 Physician's Letter (Mental and physical fitness)
- 5 Police Clearance (Certificate of Good Conduct);
- 6 Three recent passport-size photos;
- 7 Photocopy of National ID Card or Passport;
- 8 Sponsorship Letter (if Sponsored)
- 9 Minimum 18 years of age. Preference will be given to candidates younger than 35.
- 10 Proof of English Proficiency, TOEFL, IETLS, PTE, DUOLINGO
 - IELTS minimum score of 6,
 - TOEFL iBT minimum score of 75,
 - PTE (Pearson Test of English) minimum score of 50 and
 - DUOLINGO minimum score of 100.
- 11 Official receipt of application fee payment (\$100.00).
 - Vaccination: the candidate should commit to accept vaccinations for health care professionals (eg. Covid-19, Hepatitis B, Tetanus, among others)
 - Proof of Valid health insurance is mandatory at the time of registration.
